- ▶ DFW International Airport is the 3rd busiest airport in the United States (operations). DFW had 171 nonstop worldwide service with 41 nonstop international routes and 136 nonstop domestic routes in 2008. (DFW Airport)
- ▶ Nearly nine percent of all U.S. connecting passengers use DFW. (DFW Airport)
- ▶ In addition to DFW International, Love Field and Alliance Airports, the region claims 13 reliever airports in the area. (Dallas Business Journal, Book of Lists, 2009)

- ▶ DFW International Airport has an annual impact on the North Texas economy of more than \$16.6 billion and supports nearly 305,000 jobs. (DFW Airport)
- ▶ Opened in 1989, Alliance Airport was the world's first purely industrial airport. The airport is now home to over 200 companies and serves as a cargo hub for Fed Ex. (Alliance Airport)
- ▶ Alliance Airport is responsible for the creation of 99,520 direct and indirect jobs in the region, having an annual economic impact of \$2.52 billion. (Alliance Airport)
