

DEMOGRAPHICS

Demographics in the Dallas-Fort Worth region continue to change. More than 18 percent of the population is foreign-born, with Hispanics accounting for the largest minority group in the region and state. Additionally, the region's workforce is relatively young and well educated. More than 60 percent of workers 25 years of age and older have at least some college education, with nearly a third holding a bachelor's degree or other advanced degree.
