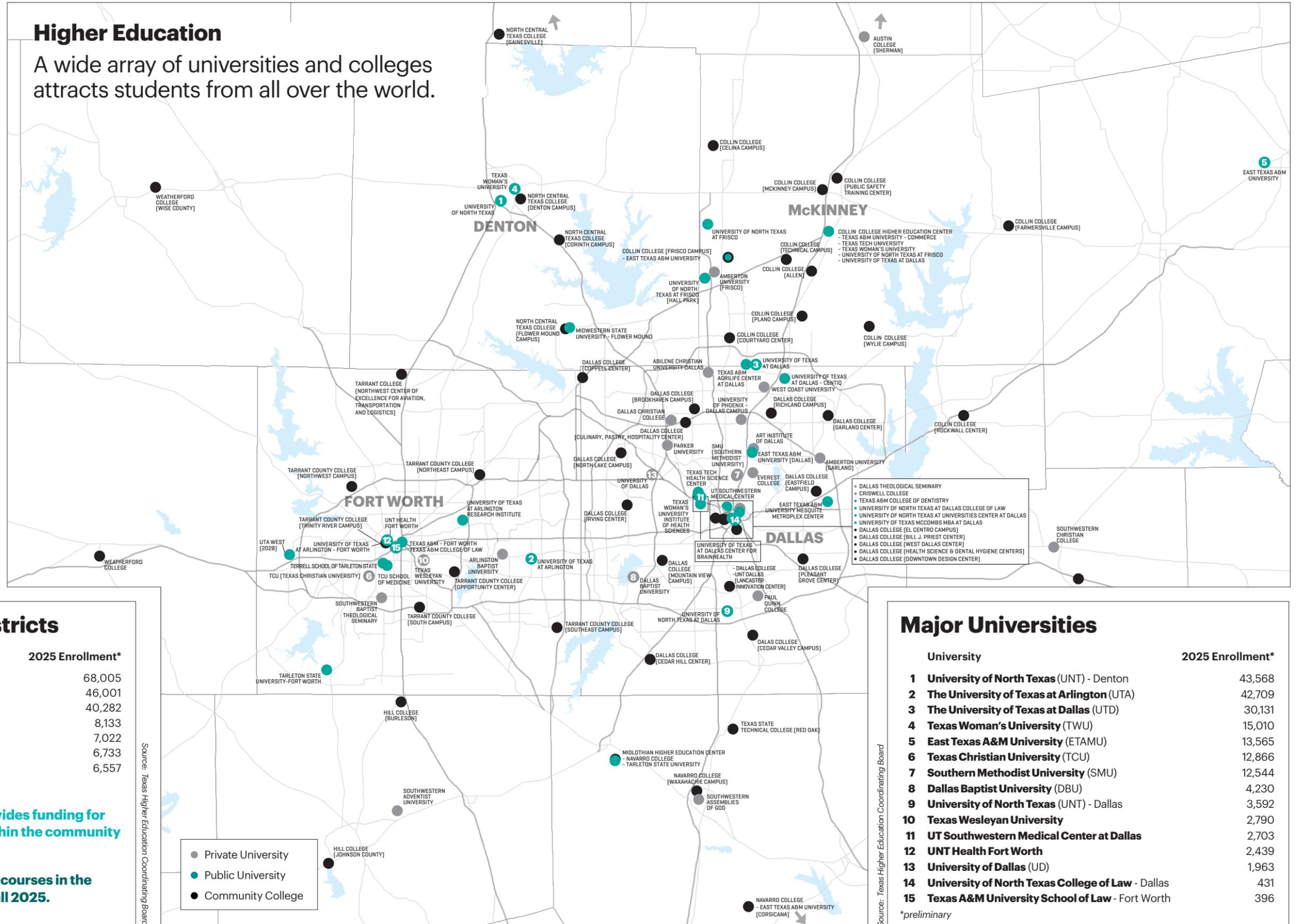


# Training, Colleges, and Universities

The Dallas-Fort Worth region offers a variety of public and private educational opportunities with robust programming in life sciences, engineering, and the arts. The University of North Texas at Denton, the University of Texas at Arlington, UT Southwestern, and Southern Methodist University are among Texas' prolific emerging research universities. These schools are expanding program capabilities and funding in pursuit of remaining at the top end of research institutions as defined by the Carnegie Classification methodology. For instance, UT Southwestern Medical Center is among the nation's top in biology and biochemistry research, boasting countless clinical breakthroughs and innovations.

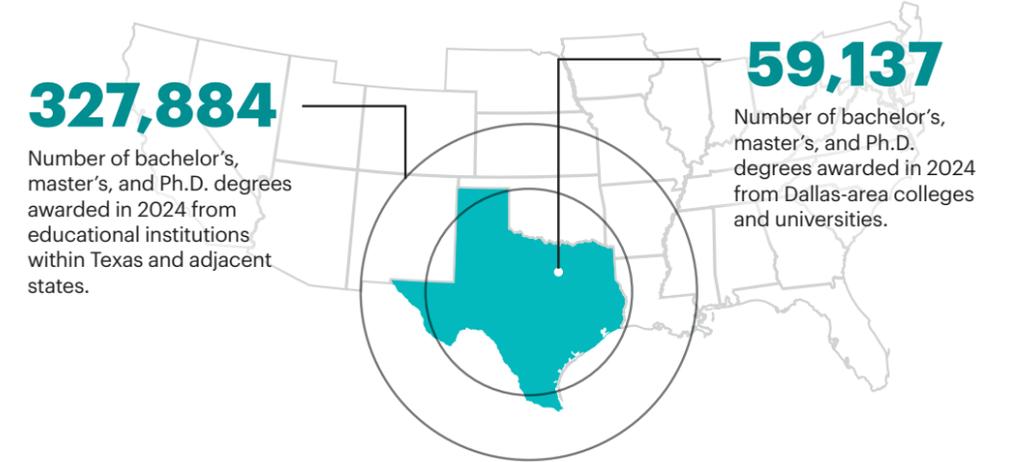
